From January to April, the DC EITC Campaign helps low-income taxpayers from across the District file their taxes for free and claim the credits that they deserve.

This tax season, Capital Area Asset Builders, D.C. Saves, and D.C. Hunger Solutions are partnering to bring food stamp outreach and other financial services straight to tax sites.

A family of 3 with one minimum wage worker could receive an estimated:

\$4,690 for the Earned Income Tax Credit
+
\$4,408 in food stamps

Totaling over \$9,000*
